REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2016

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2016. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Principal activity

The Charity's principal activities during the year were to promote the preservation of mental health and to assist in relieving and rehabilitating persons suffering from mental disorder or emotional or mental distress requiring advice or treatment in the London Borough of Ealing and surrounding areas.

Significant activities

The following are our most significant activities:

Outreach services

For clients who would benefit from additional intensive one to one support for a 6 month period due to relapse, disengagement with other services or to be used as a transitional pathway to the community or to accessing CAPE's other services. The recovery star model would be used to measure and support progress for service users towards self-reliance or other goals.

Drop in service

This is a drop in service which provides an accessible, safe and welcoming environment where our clients can socialise while learning new skills and work towards recovery.

Advocacy service

Our advocacy service will help our clients say what they want, secure their rights, represent their interests and obtain the services they need. We listen to our clients, discuss their concerns, and find out exactly what she or he really wants.

Group work

We offer a range of group activities, which are devised to increase confidence and gain skills with the aim of leading a fulfilling life.

Vocational groups

We offer IT and job search, catering, administrative, social care, customer service and retail training.

Well being groups

We promote healthy living and run a smoking cessation group.

Therapeutic groups

We run three weekly talking therapy groups, which include a hearing voices group, recovery group and depression and anxiety group.

Volunteering

We offer a wide range of volunteering opportunities for our clients and for individuals from the wider community. These include administrative duties, catering, befriending/peer support, running groups and gardening.

Advice service

Our team has a wide range of knowledge and experience in advocacy, housing, welfare benefits, debt management, training and employment and personalisation.

Public benefit

In setting our objectives and planning our activities we have given careful consideration to the Charity Commissioner's general guidance on public benefit. All our activities are undertaken in furtherance of our charitable purposes which are for the public benefit as described above.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

We were pleased to obtain funding from Industrial Therapy Organisation (ITO), Lloyds TSB Foundation, Austin & Hope Pilkington Trust and The Clothworkers' Foundation. We are very grateful for their continued support.

Fundraising activities

CAPE Shops Ltd, which is wholly owned by CAPE, opened a charity shop on 10 April 2013. The charity shop has allowed us to offer real work/volunteering opportunities to our clients. It has also helped to raise the profile of the work we do within the community. The charity would like to thank Cape Shops Limited for their £12,000 donation towards our work.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

At 31 March 2016, the charity held free reserves of £23,130 (2015: £17,734) which is short of the desired level.

Income for the year increased by 8% to £239,754 (2015 £221,963). Expenditure also increased by 7% to £237,401 (2015: £221,790) mainly due to higher staff costs. A surplus for the year of £2,353 (2015: £173) has been achieved.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The company was registered as a charity on 10 October 1997. The company was incorporated on 13 June 1997 as a company limited by guarantee of its members and not having a share capital. The company is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

CAPE is governed by a management committee comprising of the Board of Trustees who are also directors of the company. The minimum number of members of the management committee is three and there is currently no maximum number.

The Board meets every three months.

At each Annual General Meeting one-third of the Board members for the time being, or if their number is not three or a multiple of three, then the number nearest one-third shall retire from office. The Board members to retire in every year shall be those who have been longest in office since their last election.

It is the responsibility of the existing management committee to recruit new members although some of the activities can be delegated. CAPE seeks to ensure that the management committee has a diverse range of skills and experience to support its work.

The decision to search for and select a new Trustee is taken by the management committee who will agree and document the particular skills, experience and knowledge that the new Trustee should bring to the management committee

The Project Director will run an appropriate search process to identify potential candidates.

The candidates to be reviewed will be interviewed by a sub-committee of the management committee consisting of the Project Director and two other Trustees one of whom should normally be the Chair. The interviewers do not have to meet as a panel and they can meet a candidate at separate times.

Candidates can be invited to a management committee meeting as an observer or meet other Trustees and / or members of staff informally to enable the candidate to establish whether they are still happy to be elected to be a Trustee

Candidates will be asked in writing to confirm they have not been disqualified from acting as Trustees and they should consider and declare any current or potential conflicts of interest.

Candidate references will be taken up by the Project Director.

Once a preferred candidate has been identified, this candidate is proposed to the management committee who will then make the final decision on appointment.

Induction and training of new trustees

On appointment the new Trustee should be provided with the:

- a) most recent CAPE annual report
- b) latest management accounts
- c) Memorandum and Articles of Association for CAPE
- d) minutes of the most recent management committee meetings

We have audited the financial statements of COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES PROJECT EALING (CAPE) for the year ended 31 March 2016 on pages eight to seventeen. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015) (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice applicable to Smaller Entities).

The trustees have elected for the financial statements to be audited in accordance with the Charities Act 2011 rather than the Companies Act 2006. Accordingly we have been appointed as auditors under Section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 and report in accordance with regulations made under Section 154 of that Act.

In our opinion the financial statements:





1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRSSE) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015)', the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of investments which are included at market value.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Kitchen equipment	- 25% on reducing balance
Fixtures and fittings	- 25% on reducing balance
Computer equipment	- 25% on cost

Fixed assets with a cost less than £1,500 are written off in the year of purchase.

Taxation

The company is a registered charity and is exempt from all forms of taxation which are available to registered charities other than Value Added Tax. The charity is not registered for Value Added Tax. It is thus not able to recover input tax, where this is charged, and this tax is included with the relevant items of expenditure.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Pension costs

The company operates a defined contributions scheme. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company in an independently administered fund. The pension cost charge represents contributions payable by the company to the fund.

Donated services and facilities

The charity has been granted the lease of the premises from which it operates rent free by the London Borough of Ealing. As the premises are occupied rent free, the notional value of rent has been recorded within both income and expenditure.
